## WWII - Donald Patrick and John James Carrucan

Donald Patrick Carrucan, born 27<sup>th</sup> March 1914 in Traralgon in Victoria, and John James Carrucan, born 21<sup>st</sup> May 1921, were two of the children of Kevin James O'Doherty Carrucan (1885-1933) and Rubenia Beaton (1890-1984). They were great grand children of Peter Carrucan and Hannah Woods.

Both boys joined the AIF on the same day -21<sup>st</sup> June 1941. Their place of enlistment was noted as Paddington in NSW so presumably the family had moved from Traralgon to Sydney at some stage.

Donald enlisted for the army on 21<sup>st</sup> June 1941 in Paddington, NSW. Prior to this he had been employed as a Tabulating Machine Mechanic. Whilst in the Army he was a Craftsman and served overseas in the Middle East from 1<sup>st</sup> September 1941 to 25<sup>th</sup> February 1943 and in New Guinea from 31<sup>st</sup> July 1943 to 21<sup>st</sup> February 1944. He was discharged in 1944, aged 30 years, being required for employment in an essential occupation. He returned to his work as a mechanic and worked in places such as the Woomera Rocket Range. Unfortunately on return from the war he did not marry. He died 22<sup>nd</sup> April 1974 of throat cancer.

Jack also joined the army on the same day, at the tender age of 20. He served overseas in the Middle East from 1<sup>st</sup> September 1941 to 25<sup>th</sup> February 1943, New Guinea from 31<sup>st</sup> July 1943 to 21<sup>st</sup> February 1944 and Tarakan, Borneo from 28<sup>th</sup> March 1945 to 24<sup>th</sup> February 1946. Jack was discharged as part of the demobilisation on 9<sup>th</sup> April 1946.

He went on to work as an accountant at the Canberra Hospital and did not subsequently marry. He loved fishing particularly on the South Coast of NSW. His family remember him as a happy go lucky person who loved to have a beer. Whenever extended family came to visit, he loved to show everyone around Canberra and
